Meters, Hot-Skin Voltage & Surge Protector Basics

Mike Sokol is bringing his RV Electricity Seminar to the Airstream International Rally this Thursday, July 25, from 9am to 10am, in the Farm Bureau Center, East Hall (Main Stage).
Mike has been writing about RV electrical power and safety for the last 10 years, with hundreds of his No~Shock~Zone articles and videos published on RVtravel.com as well as dozens of other e-zines and owners forums. You may have already interacted with him as jmsokol on the Airstream Forum. While Mike has a 50-year background in industrial power, packaging robotics design, and building nuclear missile guidance systems, He's able to teach complex electrical topics in clear and simple language that anyone can understand. Plus he's built a series of hands-on demonstrations that shows you how to measure pedestal voltages, find RV hot-skin conditions, and understand EMS/Surge-Protector operation

Locator Board

The locator board is to the right of the south door into the Vendor/check-in room in the Farm Bureau Center. The parking lot info beside each name is the parking area letter on the map In the Rally Program. Note: In

addition to the letters, **NC** is North Campground, **SC** is South Campground, **BD** is Band on south end of F, and **R** (not the map) is the group parked just south of the underpass.

There were 679 checked-in attendees as of July 22.

Golf Cart Shuttle Service

Shuttle services are up and running. Carts are labeled with SHUTTLE signs. There are three routes around the grounds. NORTH covers the Farm Bureau Center building to the North Campground. EAST covers Farm Bureau to the Mansion, Pavilion, and J, K, and L campgrounds. SOUTH covers the VAC area. All shuttles will take to your requested destination. So, if you are picked on the NORTH route and want to head over to the VAC Tent, we will happily take you there! Shuttles are circling their routes about every 20 minutes but this is subject to change depending on cart and driver availability. Look for TROLLEY STOP signs and the shuttles will be around soon. **Hours are 08:30am-10:00pm** beginning Saturday July 20! Have a safe and happy Rally!

Meadow Event Park Guidelines

- Please do not use the trash cans for bagged household trash. Trash should go in the large blue dumpsters. For assistance locating your nearest dumpster, contact Member Services.
- Please remember that we are not allowed to dump gray water on the ground here at the Meadow Event Center.
- Washing of trailers is not allowed on grounds.
- Please do NOT drive or park golf carts or personal vehicles on the grass around Meadows Hall (aka the Mansion) and Meadow Pavilion. Thank you for your cooperation.
- Please observe a speed limit of 10 mph on the Meadow Event Park (MEP) campus. Also, note that personal vehicles are not allowed in front of the Farm Bureau Center. Parking lots are located on the east and west sides of the building.

Pump Out Schedule

The color represents the DOT that was placed on the Parking Permit placed on the front window of your rig.

Red	7/18, 7/22, 7/26
Blue	7/19, 7/23
Green	7/20, 7/24
Yellow	7/21, 7/25

Pumping will begin at 7am and continue until completion. ALL motor homes and trailers: have your compartments unlocked by 7am on your scheduled pumping day.
